# Macmillan urology cancer clinical nurse specialist team

During your treatment for cancer, our urology cancer clinical nurse specialists will be responsible for coordinating your care. This factsheet explains how the clinical nurse specialist team can support you. It also explains how you can contact our clinical nurse specialists and our urology cancer doctors.

### Your key worker

Our team of clinical nurse specialists (CNS) all specialise in urological cancers. One of them will be assigned to you as your 'key worker'. We also have a urology cancer support assistant in our team who may deal with your telephone enquiries.

Your key worker is here to support you, your family and your friends in a number of ways:

### Information and advice

Your key worker can help if you have any questions or concerns about your diagnosis and treatment. They can give you more information and advise you on a range of issues, directly or indirectly related to having cancer. They can also recommend other sources of information and advice.

You may want to know more about:

- your diagnosis
- any surgery you may need to have
- drug treatments or radiotherapy
- managing side effects of your treatment
- symptom control
- financial or work-related issues
- community help and support
- coping with an altered physical appearance
- caring for someone who has cancer
- counselling services

### Talking things through

Cancer affects people in different ways. During your diagnosis and treatment, you may experience a range of strong emotions including fear, anger, numbness or hopelessness. These feelings can be difficult to cope with and it's not unusual to have times when you feel very low.

Sometimes it can help just to talk things through. You might want to talk about making a

decision about your treatment, coming to terms with the news of your diagnosis or living with the impact that the cancer is having on you and your family.

You may get support from your family and friends, but sometimes it can be easier to talk to someone less involved, such as your key worker.

If you would find it helpful to talk, please don't hesitate to contact us. Your family and friends are also welcome to contact your key worker for support.

Alongside this factsheet, we have also given you a Macmillan Concerns checklist. This lists some common concerns that you may have and can be a useful tool to identify any information and support needs. Please let us know if you wish to discuss any of these concerns with your key worker.

## Linking with other healthcare professionals

Your key worker can be a useful link between you and other healthcare professionals involved in your care, both here at the hospital and elsewhere, such as your GP.

As one of our clinical nurse specialists, your key worker is also part of the urology cancer multi-disciplinary team (MDT). This is the wider team of experts in urological cancer looking after you and ensuring you get the best treatment for your condition at the right time.

The MDT includes:

- an MDT coordinator
- consultant urologists (specialist urology surgeons)
- oncologists (specialist cancer doctors)
- a histopathologist (specialist tissue doctor)
- a radiologist (x-ray and scan specialist doctor)
- clinical nurse specialists

The MDT meets weekly to discuss results of investigations and decide on treatment plans for patients.

## Patient initiated follow-up (PIFU)

If you have prostate or testicular cancer, we may offer you a patient initiated follow up program (PIFU). This is a type of 'remote' monitoring, which gives you more control over your health. You will have personalised care when you need it and access to test results, care records and online advice from your team on 'My Medical Record'. This is an online digital platform, similar to a website. Ask your key worker for more information.

## Clinical trials

Clinical research studies and trials help us understand health better and develop new ways of treating and managing cancer. At UHS we are one of the leading cancer research centres in the UK. We may ask you if you would like to participate in different clinical trials during your care. If you want to know more about upcoming clinical trials at UHS, ask your key worker or consultant.
