

After your child's steroid joint injection

Information for families and carers

We have given you this factsheet because your child has had a steroid injection into one or more of their joints (this is known as an intra-articular injection). It explains what to expect after having a steroid joint injection and when to seek medical advice. We hope it helps to answer some of the questions you may have. Rest

It's important that your child rests after the procedure. Your child can do gentle exercises and activities (if comfortable) but they should avoid anything strenuous for 24 hours after the procedure.

Pain relief

Your child should continue to take regular pain relief medication (for example, paracetamol and ibuprofen) as needed for up to 48 hours after the procedure. Always read the instructions that come with the medication before giving it to your child. After this time, you should reduce the medication until your child no longer needs it.

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Some children may experience an increase in pain after the procedure. If this is the case for your child, continue to give them pain relief medication and contact us for advice using the details at the end of this factsheet.

When to seek urgent medical advice

Call NHS **111** for urgent medical advice if your child's pain is not managed with regular pain relief medication or if they show any signs of infection, such as:

- increased heat, redness or discharge (pus) around the site of injection
- a fever (a temperature of 38°C or above)
- feeling generally unwell

In an emergency, go to your nearest emergency department or call **999** for an ambulance. Take this factsheet with you as it contains information about your child's procedure.

Follow-up care

We will arrange for your child to have a follow-up appointment in our rheumatology clinic two to three months after the procedure.
